Terms and Conditions of Entry to the exhibition 'Bloom'

- 1. All entries must be created by primary school children only, under the supervision of their teacher
- 2. Applicants are encouraged to re-use everyday consumables to create their artwork, but **NOT** PET bottles, these should be kept for recycling
- 3. The maximum length of each 'jellyfish' should be no more than 1.5 metres
- 4. Fremantle Markets will hang the 'jellyfish' installation from a recycled timber frame, measuring 1.8 metres x 1.8 metres please ensure you bear this in mind when determining the right number of 'jellyfish' to create. All 'jellyfish' need to have a twine hoop hanging mechanism in the centre, which must be securely attached. The example shown, using tinsel, CDs etc is 1.5 metres long, by 28cms wide. If all artwork was prepared in this size, then the frame could accommodate a maximum of 48 'jellyfish'
- 5. Registration to take part in the exhibition/competition closes at **5pm on the 30**th **of September**. Please click this link to register!
- 6. Each school will be allowed one entry
- 7. Entries must acknowledge all sources used. A photograph of your installation, with details of materials used, will be uploaded to our website. Registering and entering the competition assumes you agree with this acknowledgement
- 8. Fremantle Markets reserves the right to take photographs of the installation, for marketing / promotional purposes (always with an acknowledgement of the school's contribution)
- 9. Entries must be hand-delivered to the Markets between **Friday 1**st **November** and **Monday 4**th **November**, to be included in the exhibition/competition
- 10. Entries will be judged by Fremantle Markets visitors, between 8th November 2019 and Friday 31st January 2020, via the completion of voting slips on-site
- 11. The highest number of votes will be awarded 1st, 2nd and 3rd place and receive prizes of \$1000, \$500 and \$250 respectively. Winning schools will be notified by email in early February
- 12. Schools must agree to collect their installation from Fremantle Markets, between Monday 2nd February and Friday 7th February 2020, for deconstruction and reuse
